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Safety precautions

Information for parents

Bluetooth®

Your phone has a Bluetooth interface. This makes it possible to establish a wireless connection with your phone and a headset, car kit, or other Bluetooth-enabled devices.

In order to establish a secure link between the devices and to prevent a third party from having access to your phone, you should observe the following points:

- The initial connection between two devices, what is called "pairing", should take place in familiar surroundings.
- Both devices must be able to identify themselves one time by using a password/PIN. To ensure sufficient security, you should choose a 16-digit number combination for a password that would be difficult to guess (if a PIN has not been assigned).
- An automatic connection acceptance ("connection without confirmation") should only be used in exceptional cases.
- In general, only trustworthy devices should be linked in order to minimise security risks.
- You should restrict the "visibility" of your phone if possible. This will make it much more difficult for unknown devices to establish a connection with your phone. To do this, in the Bluetooth menu, set the option Discoverable from Yes to No (page 35).
- The name of your phone is transmitted in a Bluetooth connection. The factory default is the "BENQ EF71". The first time Bluetooth is activated, or later in the Bluetooth menu, you can change this name (page 36).
- If Bluetooth is not needed, this function should be deactivated.

Before using Bluetooth accessories, or a mobile phone inside a vehicle, check the vehicle user guide for any limitations on the use of these products.





Getting started

Removing the back cover


- 1. Slide to remove the back cover as illustrated.
- 2. Lift the cover off the phone.



Inserting the SIM card

- Remove the back cover and the battery. Slide the SIM card holder backwards.
- 2. Insert the SIM card into the card holder. Ensure that the cut corner is at the top left and the metal contacts face the phone.

3. Slide the SIM card holder forwards.



A SIM card can be easily damaged if its metal contacts become scratched. So take special care when holding or inserting it.

Inserting the battery

- Slide the bottom end of the battery down into the bottom end of the battery bay.
- 2. Press the top end of the battery down so that it locks into place.



Switch off your phone before removing the battery.

Installing the back cover

Place the back cover onto the back of your phone and slide it forwards until the latch catches the cover




microSD card

The microSD card gives your phone a very large memory capacity. This allows you to save multimedia data, including images, photos, MP3 audio files, ringtones and Java games. You can also use this memory card to store any other files

Inserting the microSD card

- 1. Slide the microSD card holder backwards to release it, and lift it up.
- Insert the microSD card into the card holder. Ensure that the card's metal contacts face the phone.
- 3. Slide the card holder forwards to lock it.

- Your phone does not support a microSD card in FAT32 or NTFS format

Removing the microSD card

- 1. Slide the microSD card holder backwards to release it, and lift it up.
- 2. Remove the microSD card.
- Slide the card holder forwards to lock it.

Charging the battery

The battery is not fully charged when first unpacked.

- 1. Attach the larger end of the provided data cable to the power adapter.
- Plug the smaller end of the data cable into the connector jack on the left edge of your phone with the arrow showing upwards.
- 3. Plug the power adapter to an appropriate wall socket and charge for at least 4 hours.
- 4. Once the phone is fully charged, remove the data cable from both the wall socket and the phone.

Alternatively, you can connect the phone to the USB port on your computer with the provided data cable for charging.

- Do not remove the battery while charging.
- It takes approximately 4 hours to fully charge a battery.
- When the battery is discharged, the charging process may not start immediately when you plug in the connector.
 Wait 10 to 15 minutes for the phone to begin charging.
- Charging is only possible within a temperature range of 0 °C (+32 °F) to +45 °C (+113 °F).

When the battery is low, you will be warned by an alert sound.

Switching the phone on/off

Switching the phone on

- Press and hold by to switch the phone on. The phone will display the welcome animation (page 47).
- 2. When asked, enter your PIN code and confirm with .

The PIN (Personal Identification Number) is the password provided by your network operator. You need this password in order to use the SIM card.

When the PIN code entered has been accepted, the phone will automatically search for the designated network. This search process may take a few seconds.

If you enter the PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card will be locked. You must now enter the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) for that SIM card in order to unlock it. Please contact your service provider to obtain a PUK. To activate/deactivate the PIN, see page 15.

Standby mode

The phone is in standby mode and is ready for use when the name of the service provider is displayed on the standby screen.

Press and hold ____ to return to standby mode from any situation.

Signal strength

The signal strength is indicated in the top left corner of the display. More bars indicate a stronger signal.



Strong signal.

If the phone is not able to detect the designated network, or links to a network that you are not authorised to use, the signal strength meter will show no bars. You will only be able to make emergency calls.

Emergency Call (SOS)

You can make an emergency call even if your phone is locked or cannot access your network, or if there is no SIM card inserted, as long as you are within range of a network of the type supported by your phone.

1. Enter 112 (the international emergency number).

2. Press .

Switching the phone off

Press and hold to switch the phone off.

General instructions

DRM

This phone features Digital Rights Management (DRM) technology. DRM allows copyright-protected audio/visual content transmissions for playback in computers, portable devices and network devices, while protecting them from unauthorised use.

Navigating the menus

The phone features various functions and settings organised in menus and sub-menus.

To select a function from menus:

- 1. Press in standby mode to open the main menu.
- 2. Use and to scroll up, down, right or left through the main menu. For example, scroll to Settings.
- 3. Press to enter the menu.
- 4. Press to scroll to a submenu, for example Profiles.
- 5. Press to confirm selection.

- 6. Press to scroll to the desired option, for example, Normal.
- 7. Press to confirm selection.
 - · You can also access a function by pressing the corresponding menu number: e.g. open the main menu and press wxyz o to access Settings.
 - In this user guide, the steps needed to reach a menu are shown in a condensed form, for example: Settings > Profiles > Normal

Security

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

- · If you enter the PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card will be locked. You have to enter the PUK for that SIM card in order to unlock it. Please contact your network operator to obtain a PUK.
- If the PUK has been lost, please contact your network operator.

Security codes

PIN1	(Personal Identification Number) Protects your SIM card from unauthorised use.
PIN2	Needed for some settings and to change the PIN2.

PUK PUK2	(Personal Unblocking Key) Used to unlock SIM cards af- ter the wrong PIN1 has been entered incorrectly three consecutive times.
Phone lock	Protects your phone from unauthorised use. If it is activated, you have to enter the phone code when the phone is switched on (default: 1234).
SIM lock	If it is activated, you have to enter the SIM code to use the phone with another SIM card (default: 1234).

PIN Code

The PIN is the password provided by your network operator and is usually requested each time the phone is switched on. You can deactivate this feature but you risk unauthorised use of the phone. Some network operators do not permit deactivating the control.

PIN1 Code

Changing the PIN status

- Select Set Status.
- Select On/Off to activate/deactivate PIN control.
- 3. Enter PIN and confirm with .



Changing the PIN

You can change the PIN to any 4 to 8-digit number.

- 1. Enter current PIN code and confirm with .
- 2. Enter new PIN code and confirm with .
- 3. Re-enter new PIN code and confirm with .

PIN2 Code

Proceed as with PIN1 code.

Phone lock

You can define the phone code (4 to 8-digits). If activated, the phone code is requested when the phone is switched on.

To activate the phone lock or change the phone code, proceed as with PIN1 code.

When the phone is locked, only emergency calls can be made.

SIM lock

You can define the SIM code (4 to 8-digits). When activating the SIM lock, you have to enter the previously set SIM code (Default: 1234). If the SIM code is activated, you have to enter the SIM code to use another SIM card on the phone.

Text entry

Input methods

When an editing screen is displayed, the current text input method is indicated in the upper right corner of the display. The following are some of the input methods. To have more options for entering texts, go to Settings > Input to select the desired input methods.



T9 text input including the input language, e.g. English.

Numeric input

Changing the input method

Press repeatedly to select an input method.

T9 supports several input languages. The dictionary depends on the current input language. When selecting T9 please take note of the correct input language.

Shifting between upper and lower case letters

Press *(30)# and hold to switch between lower and upper case letters.

Using T9 text input

- Press each key associated with the letter you want to enter only once. The letters you have entered appear on the display. The candidate words change with each key you press.
- If the first highlighted word is not the word you want, press to highlight the desired word.
- 3. Press to enter the highlighted word
- 4. Press 0 to insert a space.
 Press and hold to insert a line feed.
- 5. Press to move the cursor.
- Press to delete the letter to the left of the cursor or marked text.
 Press and hold to delete all entered text.

Adding a new word

If a desired word is not in the list of candidate words, the word is not yet included in the dictionary. You can add the word to the dictionary.

- 1. Press (Spell).

The next time you enter the word, it will be in the list of candidate words.

Correcting a word

- Press to move left or right, word by word, until the desired word is highlighted.
- 2. Press to scroll through the T9 word suggestions again.
- 3. Press to delete the character to the left of the cursor.
- 4. Press to enter the corrected word.

Using text input without T9

- Press a number key repeatedly until the required letter appears. After a brief interval the cursor will advance. Example:
- 2. Press **2** abc once to enter the letter "a", twice to enter "b", etc.
- Press to delete the letter to the left of the cursor.

If the voicemail number is not stored on your SIM card, you cannot access your voicemail by pressing and holding and long. In this case you will need to set the number manually at Messages > Voicemail > Set Number (page 35).

Ending a call

Recording a call

- FM transmitter performance may be influenced by FM receiver sensitivity, local radio interference and user preference. When a call is transferred to an FM radio by FM transmitter, the FM radio may be interfered by radio signals generated by other mobile devices.

Activating Silent profile

To avoid the disturbance caused by a ringing phone, you can activate the Silent profile. Incoming calls are signalled by vibrating without ringing.

- Press and hold in standby mode to activate/deactivate the silent profile.
- With flip closed, press and hold the volume key to activate/deactivate the silent profile.

When the Silent profile is activated, the phone vibrates for a second and is displayed in the status bar of the standby display.

Your Phone Book

The capacity of a phone book on your SIM card depends on the type of SIM card provided by your network operator.

Adding new contacts

1. Enter the number in standby mode.

You can also select Phone Book > Add to add a new contact.

- 2. Press (Save) to save the number as a contact.
- 3. Select a save location: To SIM/To Phone.
- 4. Scroll to the desired data field and press to edit the field.





Specify the duration of the LCD backlight, and how long the keypad backlight remains on after the last key is pressed.

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
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
